Stripy Parvum (meaning “small” in Latin) is the soul of the Stripy Pullover Family - it is a figure hugging and very flattering everyday jumper. Worked top-down, the highly elastic neckline and short rows adjust to your neck and shoulders, while the compound raglan shaping creates a yoke that flatters every body and that is highly functional. The pullover can be made cropped or full length to desired length and the sleeves are narrow and tapered to fit to your arms. The thin striping throughout allows for an opportunity to be playful with color and stash bust, while creating a classic garment that belongs in everyone’s wardrobe. The pattern includes size-specific progress tables that make crocheting this jumper a breeze!



SAMPLE INFORMATION

Sample is Size 4 cropped and used Cascade Heritage, Solids (75% Merino Wool, 25% Nylon; 437 yds (400 m) / 100 g) in the colorway Mustard for MC; and Less Traveled Yarn, Coupe (80% Superwash Merino Wool, 10% Cashmere, 10% Nylon; 382 yds / 100 g) in the colourway Vice for CC.



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YARDAGE REQUIREMENTS

YARN: Fingering weight yarn (size 1)

For a cropped pullover:

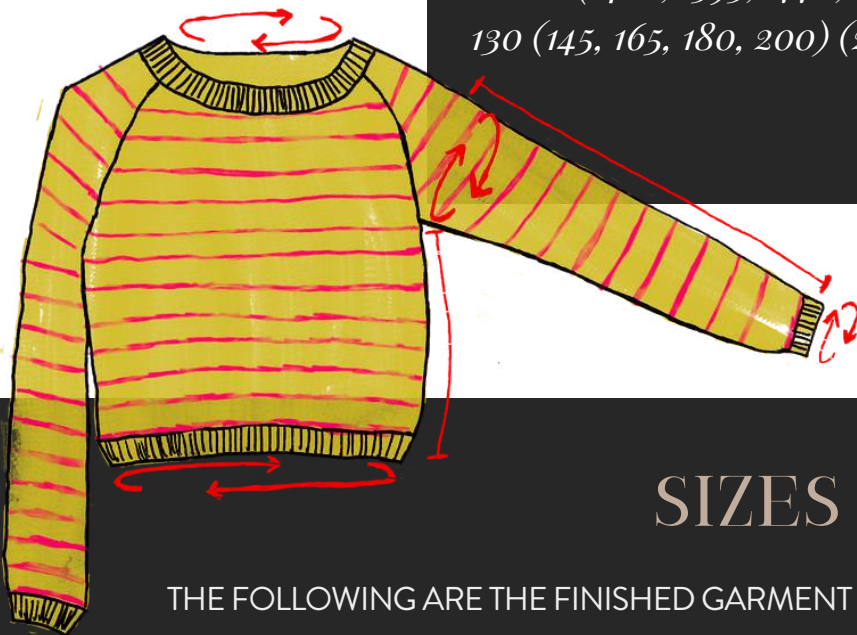
950 (1075, 1205, 1340, 1455) (1595, 1710, 1890, 1995) m / 1040 (1175, 1315, 1465, 1590) (1745, 1870, 2065, 2180) yds of MC.

105 (120, 135, 150, 165) (175, 190, 210, 220) m / 115 (130, 150, 165, 180) (195, 210, 230, 240) yds of CC.

For a full-length pullover:

1150 (1300, 1460, 1620, 1765) (1925, 2065, 2270, 2400) m / 1260 (1420, 1595, 1770, 1930) (2105, 2265, 2480, 2625) yds of MC.

130 (145, 165, 180, 200) (215, 230, 255, 270) m / 140 (160, 180, 200, 220) (235, 250, 280, 295) yds of CC.

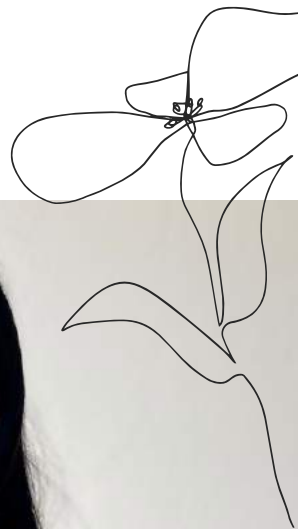

I used several Merino and Merino nylon mix minis in different shades of green. My main color were tweed minis

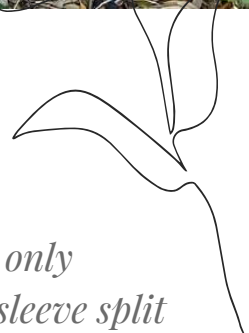


MODS

The fit is perfect as usual.



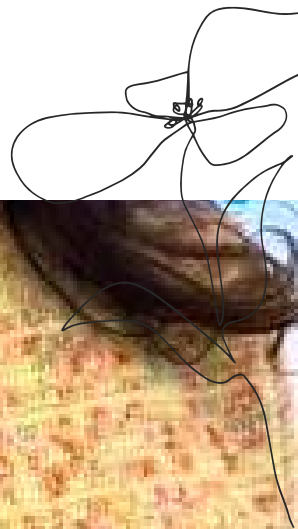

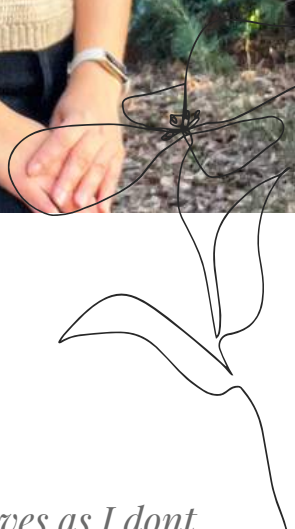


MODS

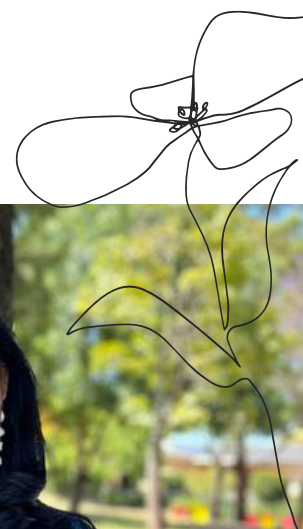

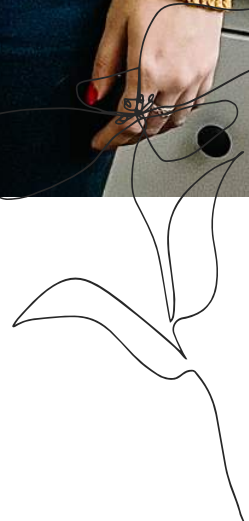


MODS

The fit of the sweater is absolutely perfect and there was no confusion at any point in the pattern.



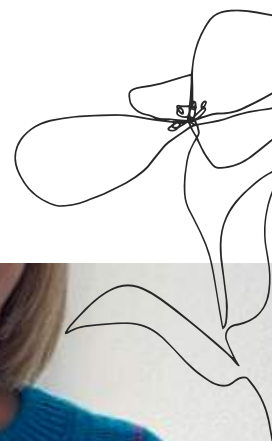

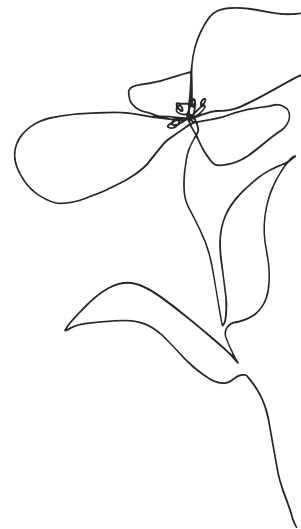

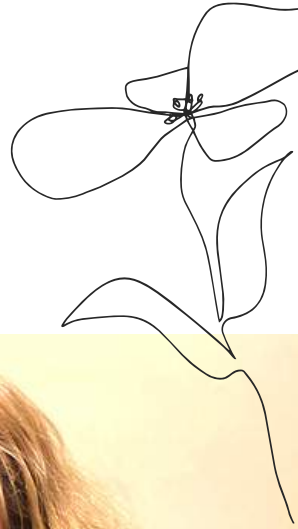

MODS

I didn't do bottom ribbing as I ran out of green yarn and instead did a few rows of cc. I also did opposite colour combination for sleeves

Absolutely loved this pattern. Did not get bored once. Instructions are very thorough and the charts at the back well laid and clear. Brilliant design Sandra!

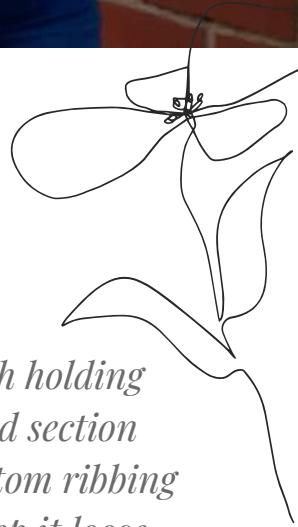

*Lilac, MC: Kicsikato indie yarn,
400m/100g merino, 5 skeins, Lana
Grossa silkhair in lavender, 2,5 skeins,
Lana Grossa Solo Lino shade 45, 3
skeins*



MODS

A subtle striping made with holding silkhair to MC in every 2nd section (only DC rows). In the bottom ribbing made 1 stich/ribbing to keep it loose.

COMMENTS

Great pattern, very easy to follow, crochet up really easy (with the exception of ribbing for me). Got lots of compliments already.

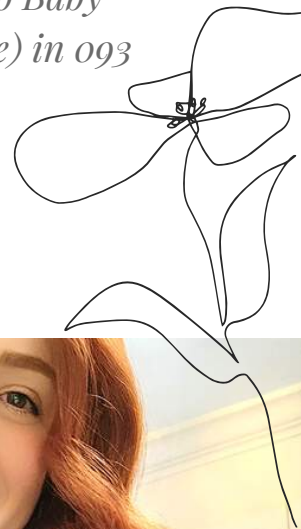


CASSANDRA MILLER

MODS

I added several inches to the body length so that it went past my hips for a longer fit. Additionally on the ribbing for both the cuffs and the hem I alternated slts 2/1 instead of doing 2 slts after each rib.

COMMENTS

This pattern is extremely well written, thoughtful and clear! The fit is amazing!
